

1. SUNDANCE LODGES IS A FAMILY CAMPGROUND with QUIET HOURS 10:30pm - 8am.

Music: keep low at ALL TIMES; music must be turned OFF at 10:30pm and voices kept low.

Alcohol: consume ONLY on your campsite; do not carry around the campground.

Not allowed at ANY TIME: loud music, noisy parties or offensive behavior. Disturbances should be reported to the office the next morning.

If this doesn't fit with your view of camping, we suggest you find a different campground

- 2. NO REFUNDS/ RAINCHECKS** after your check-in time / if you leave early / for no shows.
- 3. FIREWOOD: collecting deadwood (scavenging) is illegal in Kananaskis Country. Fines start @ \$250.00.**
You may bring firewood or buy it at the Trading Post. And please don't pick the flowers!
- 4. TENTS: place on site's gravel pad or you will be asked to move them. Picnic tables must remain on the site.**
- 5. SPEED LIMIT: 15km/hr** - please watch for children playing. All terrain vehicles/dirt bikes not allowed.
- 6. PETS: must be well-behaved, leashed, must not disturb other guests; may not be left alone on the site.**
- 7. CAMPFIRES:** permitted in designated firepits only. **Do not leave unattended!**
- 8. VALUABLES:** keep locked in the trunk of your vehicle.
- 9. VISITORS: must leave the campground by 11 pm.** Visitors are your responsibility & must be signed in.
- 10. THIS IS BEAR COUNTRY All mountain campgrounds practice food & garbage control.**
 - Store all food (including food coolers) & items with strong odour (e.g. toothpaste, perfume, candles, cosmetics) in **closed vehicle when not in use**. It is illegal not to do so.
 - Such items left unattended may be removed & offenders may be charged.
 - **No food/garbage allowed in your tent** or left unattended on your site. **Do NOT** place garbage in the firepit.
 - Put all litter & garbage in **sealed GARBAGE BAGS** – these **must** go into the **BEAR-PROOF BINS**.

CHECK-OUT TIME: 11 am for Tipis & Trapper's Tents | 12 noon for campsites.

Are you in a Tipi or Trapper's Tent? Heater & Lantern Instructions are inside each tent.

- **Practice lighting your heater & lantern on arrival.** Inform the office by 6 pm if you need help lighting the heater or lantern. *Damages resulting from not following the instructions correctly are the responsibility of the camper*
- **Refueling is done only once in the afternoon by our staff automatically, so please don't ask them to return at a later time**
- **Do not leave heater/lantern unattended:** turn off when you leave the site
- **Do not bump or shake the lantern:** this will cause leaks or break the glass; charges for the lantern glass: \$10
- **Trapper's Tent Windows - always leave partially open for ventilation when the heater /lantern is turned on**

Tipis are an Adventure! When it's raining, use the "drip trick" (old native idea):

Tipis naturally shed water down the inside of their poles. If the water hits a knot in the wood, it may start to drip so there may be some drips on the beds when you go in. To **re-track the drip** over the knot & down the pole again:

- **Lick your finger and rub the knot on the pole up & down several times; then drag your finger down the Pole, 8-10" . This should re-track the drip over the knot (surface tension).**
- If you can't reach the knot, try using a twig or.... just move your bed - leave 3' clearance for the heater.
- **Do not remove the raincatcher** up top or the **ozan** hanging beneath it (the ozan helps to catch stray drips).

All campers:**Emergency Calls (police / ambulance / fire) - dial 911**

- Failure to abide by these rules may result in eviction without refund; please inform members of your group.
- Trails along the river are not supervised; river banks are undercut in places – extreme caution required.
- If you do not want your name/site number given out to visitors asking for you, you must notify the office at check-in.
- Sites unoccupied for more than 24 hours are considered vacant unless the office is notified of your absence beforehand.
- Trading Post Washrooms are closed for cleaning every day after lunch (outhouses are always open) and for brief periods of maintenance.
- The generator that produces our electricity may be shut down for a few hours on weeknights during the night in spring & fall; if so, notices will be posted in the washrooms.
